



Continuing my efforts to secure additional parking for our Church, I met with the person who should be in control of the property immediately across from the Church (to the North) and their attorney two weeks ago [end of July]. The property is still tied up in a Federal Bankruptcy proceeding but should be exiting the Bankruptcy Estate by the end of the year. Shortly thereafter, I will meet with the parties again to further discuss alternative means whereby Hopewell United Methodist Church could purchase, lease or secure an easement in regards to one to two acres of such land to at least facilitate parking. There can be no assurance that we will be successful, but we will make every effort to shed the reputation of "the little Church with no parking".

A Glimpse at Hopewell History -- from the 1976 history by Rev. Dale Epple

A statement in the Quarterly Conference of Dec. 31, 1881 gives at least sketchy evidence that Hopewell and Gambier [societies] were established in the same year of 1832. Ohio Conference records from the 1830's show that prior to 1832 there was no permanent preaching place in Mt. Vernon. From then onwards, Mt. Vernon was a regular appointment. Gambier Methodists, according to record traveled to the Pleasant Valley (Monroe Mills) area for worship with other Methodists at Browne's house on Schenk's Creek. It is doubtful that Methodists in the Hopewell area traveled that far. It is more likely that Hopewell was an area into which forays of the Mt. Vernon circuit riders ventured, or that members of the society journeyed into Mt. Vernon for worship.

A frame structure 36' by 40' was built under the auspices of Rev. Allen Moffat in 1855.
